Union Home Minister Amit Shah Approves ₹1,658 Crore Recovery And Reconstruction Plan For Joshimath

- Joshimath, a town in Uttarakhand, faced severe challenges due to landslides and ground subsidence. The high-level central committee, led by Union Home Minister Amit Shah, approved a comprehensive recovery and reconstruction (R&R) plan amounting to ₹1,658.17 crore to address the aftermath of these natural disasters.
- The National Disaster Response Fund (NDRF) will contribute ₹1079.96 crore through the Recovery and Reconstruction window. The state will provide ₹126.41 crore from its State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) and an additional ₹451.80 crore from the state budget.

Blod+: India's First On-Demand Blood Platform

• Blod.in has unveiled its groundbreaking healthcare

software and logistics platform, **Blod+**. This innovation aims to revolutionize blood management and delivery, addressing



the alarming issue of blood wastage in healthcare facilities across the country.

- The platform's mission is to ensure that **hospitals** have steady access to blood, ultimately reducing wastage significantly. Blod+ has set new industry standards by significantly reducing the average sourcing time for blood.
- Blod+ surpasses industry norms, reducing the average sourcing time for blood from 6 hours to an average of **2 hours and 7 minutes**. This remarkable improvement ensures that critical patients receive timely access to blood, potentially saving countless lives.

RBI's Successful Withdrawal 97.26% Of ₹2,000 Banknotes In India

• The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has achieved a significant milestone in its monetary policy as it successfully withdrew 97.26 percent of the ₹2,000 banknotes from circulation as of May 19, 2023.

- This move was initiated due to the fulfillment of its objective of introducing these notes, which was to meet the currency requirements of the economy after the withdrawal of legal tender status of all ₹500 and ₹1,000 banknotes in circulation during the November-December 2016 demonetization.
- As of November 30, 2023, the total value of ₹2,000 banknotes in circulation has dwindled to ₹9,760 crore, representing a significant reduction from the initial ₹3.56 lakh crore.

Cabinet Approves Terms For 16th Finance Commission

- Recently, the Union Cabinet greenlit the terms of reference for the Sixteenth Finance
 - Commission (SFC).
 The SFC is slated to submit its comprehensive report by October 31, 2025, covering a five-year period set to



take effect on April 1, 2026. The terms of reference also include a notable clause concerning the disaster management fund.

• The terms of reference, as released by the Cabinet, predominantly encompass constitutionally mandated provisions including the distribution of net proceeds of taxes between the Central government and the states, principles governing grants-in-aid of state revenues from the Consolidated Fund of India, and measures to supplement resources for panchayats and municipalities in the states.

India's Q2 GDP Soars To 7.6%, Outpacing Projections

India's economy experienced a remarkable growth

of 7.6% during the July-September quarter of the fiscal year 2023-24 (Q2FY24). This places India firmly as the fastest-



growing major economy globally, as per the recent GDP data unveiled by the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation on November 30.

• The substantial uptick in GDP was primarily propelled by robust performances in key sectors,



- including manufacturing, mining, and construction. Notably, government spending played a pivotal role in bolstering economic expansion during this period.
- The Q2 GDP growth surpassed both market expectations and the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) projections. The RBI had maintained a more conservative outlook, anticipating a **real GDP growth** of 6.5% for the fiscal year 2023-24.

PM Modi Launches LeadIT 2.0, Focusing On Inclusive Industry Transition

- On the sidelines of the 28th edition of the climate change conference, COP28, taking place in Dubai, Prime Minister Narendra Modi unveiled LeadIT 2.0 on Friday.
- The initiative, with a primary focus on an **inclusive** and **just industry transition**, aims to facilitate the codevelopment and transfer of low-carbon technology while providing financial assistance to emerging economies.
- by promoting cooperation between nations for the development and transfer of low-carbon technologies. The focus on inclusivity underscores the importance of ensuring that emerging economies have access to sustainable and environmentally friendly technologies.

PM Modi Proposes To Host COP33 In India In 2028

• Prime Minister Narendra Modi extended India's

commitment to climate action by proposing to host the UN climate meet

(COP33) in 2028. This offer was made during his address at the inaugural session of the World Climate



Action Summit at COP28 in Dubai.

3 Indian-origin women scientists among Australia's "Superstars Of STEM"

• Three Indian-origin women are among 60 scientists,

technologists, engineers, and mathematicians who have been selected as **Australia's**



Superstars of STEM. This initiative aims to smash society's gender assumptions about scientists and increase the public visibility of females and non-binary people.

- This year among those recognised as Superstars of STEM include three Indian-origin women: Neelima Kadiyala, Dr Ana Baburamani, and Dr Indrani Mukherjee. Female scientists of Sri Lankan descent have also been chosen for distinction, in addition to Indians.
- Every year Science and Technology Australia (STA), which is the country's peak body in the sector and represents more than 105,000 scientists and technologists, supports 60 Australian experts employed in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) to become highly visible media and public role models.
- The government intends to scale up the program, according to Australia's Minister of Industry and Science Ed Husic, who spoke at the event. The national STEM Program is currently being reviewed by the government, and it is intended to be scaled up even more

India's Concerns Lead To Non-Signing Of COP28 Health & Climate Declaration

- India, a notable absentee from the list of signatories at the 28th UN Climate Change Conference (COP28), refrained from endorsing the COP28 Declaration on Climate and Health.
- The primary point of contention arises from India's apprehensions about the practicality and achievability



- of reducing greenhouse gas emissions for cooling within its healthcare infrastructure.
- India, facing significant healthcare challenges, expressed reservations about committing to the reduction of greenhouse gases for cooling applications within its healthcare facilities.
- A central objective of the declaration is a commitment to combating inequalities within and among countries. It stresses policies that accelerate the achievement of Development the Sustainable Goals (SDGs), particularly SDG3, focusing on good health and wellbeing.

Gajraj System: AI-Based Elephant Protection On Indian Railways

- The Indian Railways has initiated a pioneering step towards wildlife conservation by deploying the "Gajraj system," an Artificial Intelligence (AI)based solution designed to prevent elephant fatalities on railway tracks.
- This surveillance system is being implemented along a 700-kilometer stretch in forest areas to alert locomotive pilots of elephants' presence on the tracks, thereby mitigating the risk of collisions.

The system send Alerts to the train controller, station master, train drivers, and other stakeholders, when an elephant steps onto the track, the system detects the presence. The system proved notably effective in its initial deployment, with improvements based on field experience.

Cyclone Michaung Likely To Enter Andhra Pradesh

The deep depression looming over the Bay of Bengal

rapidly has intensified, evolving into a severe cyclonic storm named 'Michaung' as the latest



- update from the Indian Meteorological Department (IMD).
- Cyclone Michaung is forecasted to make landfall near Bapatla on the morning of December 5, around



12 pm. Eight districts—Tirupati, Nellore, Prakasam, Bapatla, Krishna, West Godavari, Konaseema, and Kakinada—have been put on high alert.

The IMD predicts the wind speed to escalate to severe cyclonic levels, with a maximum sustained speed ranging between 90-100 kmph, gusting up to 110 kmph. The impending cyclone is poised to unleash heavy rains across significant portions of Tamil Nadu, southern Andhra Pradesh, and southern Odisha.

"**Project BHISHM**" (Bharat Health Initiative for Sahyog Hita and Maitri), unveiled in February 2022.

The heart of this innovative disaster hospital lies in its 72 cubes, each containing an array of essential equipment and supplies. Among these are

- an operation theatre, a mini-ICU, ventilators, blood test equipment, an X-ray machine, a cooking station, food, water, shelter, a power generator, and more.
- One of the most remarkable features of the Aarogya Maitri Cube is its ability to handle a wide range of severe injuries. This include 40 bullet injuries, 25 major burns, around 10 head injuries, long limb fractures, spinal injuries, chest injuries, and spinal fractures.

This marked a significant drop from the previous year's count of 103.4 cases, showcasing a consistent decline. In 2020, the number was higher at 129.5, indicating a positive trend in crime reduction.
- Following Kolkata in the rankings were **Pune**, with 280.7 cases, and **Hyderabad**, with 299.2 cases, of cognisable offences per lakh population. The report issued rankings after comparing 19 cities with over 20 lakh population, emphasizing the significant achievement of Kolkata in maintaining its status as the safest city.

The eruption occurred on December 3, 2023, catching many by surprise as authorities scrambled to evacuate those in the vicinity.
- As Mount Marapi unleashed its fury, a massive cloud of volcanic ash blanketed the sky and debris covered roads and vehicles. The eruption took place with 75 people in the area and while efforts were made to evacuate. 26 individuals were left behind.
- Indonesia is situated on the "Ring of Fire," a volatile tectonic region known for its seismic and volcanic activity. The country boasts 127 active volcanoes and Mount Marapi, standing at 2,891 meters (approximately 9,500 feet), is among the most active on Sumatra.

Google Reveals 'Gemini', Its Biggest AI Model

- Google parent company **Alphabet** made a significant announcement on December 6, unveiling **Gemini**, its latest and most advanced AI model to date. Gemini represents a major leap forward for the tech giant in the rapidly evolving field of artificial intelligence.
- Gemini marks the first AI model to emerge from Alphabet following the merger of its renowned AI research units, **DeepMind** and **Google Brain**. The amalgamation has given rise to a unified division

- named **Google DeepMind**, helmed by DeepMind CEO Demis Hassabis.
- Gemini sets itself apart by being "multimodal," demonstrating the ability to comprehend and process diverse types of information concurrently. This includes text, code, audio, images, and videos, positioning Gemini as a versatile tool for a wide range of applications.

Taylor Swift Named Time Magazine's Person Of The Year

- Taylor Swift has been named Time Magazine's Person of the Year for 2023. This recognition comes on the heels of her title as the most-played artist on Spotify, underscoring the widespread impact of her music and influence.
- This honour serves as a reflection of her multifaceted impact on music, culture, and society. Beyond the accolades and financial success, Swift's ability to connect with audiences on a global scale showcases the enduring power of her artistry.
- Swift faced tough competition for the Person of the Year title, standing out among a diverse group of finalists that included Barbie, King Charles III, and OpenAI chief executive Sam Altman. Time Magazine's selection acknowledges not only Swift's individual achievements but also her cultural resonance and influence.

Lahore Leads In Global Pollution Ranking

- Lahore, the second-largest city in Pakistan, recently earned the dubious distinction of having the worst air quality in the world, with a hazardous Air Quality Index (AQI) of 400 in the morning.
- The AQI is calculated based on five categories of pollutants: ground-level ozone, particulate matter, carbon monoxide, sulfur dioxide, and nitrogen dioxide. Each of these pollutants has distinct sources, ranging from industrial emissions to vehicular exhaust and agricultural activities.
- The consequences of Lahore's air quality crisis extend beyond mere discomfort. Prolonged exposure to high levels of air pollution can lead to severe health issues, including respiratory problems, cardiovascular diseases, and other respiratory illnesses.



China Unveils World's First 4th-Generation Nuclear Reactor

China has achieved a significant milestone in its quest

to shift away from traditional coal-fired power plants and decrease its reliance on foreign technologies.



- Recently, the Shidao
 - **Bay nuclear power plant** in eastern Shandong province commenced commercial operations, heralding the era of next-generation gas-cooled nuclear reactors.
- The Shidao Bay plant distinguishes itself by utilizing two high-temperature reactors cooled by gas, a departure from conventional pressurized water cooling systems.
- A noteworthy aspect of the Shidao Bay project is its emphasis on domestically developed technology. More than 90 percent of the plant's equipment is of Chinese design, showcasing the nation's capability to innovate and implement advanced nuclear solutions independently.

Poland's Parliament Elects Donald Tusk As Prime Minister

- In a historic vote on December 11, former EU leader Donald Tusk returned as Poland's Prime Minister after nearly a decade, marking a significant shift from eight years of stormy national conservative rule.
- Tusk's leadership is expected to usher in a new-pro-European era, with promises to restore democratic standards and improve ties with European allies.
- The parliamentary vote in support of Tusk was 248-201 in the 460-seat lower house of parliament. Tusk's leadership is anticipated to usher in a new era, with a focus on restoring democratic values and improving Poland's relations with the EU.

India Backs Urgent Ceasefire In Israel-Gaza Conflict

• India voted in favor of a UN General Assembly (UNGA) resolution calling for an immediate humanitarian ceasefire in the Israel-Hamas conflict and the unconditional release of hostages.

- The 193-member UNGA adopted the resolution introduced by Egypt in an Emergency Special Session. The resolution garnered 153 votes in favor, with 23 nations abstaining and 10 voting against.
- Sponsored by several nations, including Algeria, Bahrain, Iraq, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, UAE, and Palestine, the resolution demands an immediate humanitarian ceasefire in Gaza.
- It reiterates the obligation for all parties to comply with international law, particularly regarding the protection of civilians. The resolution also calls for the immediate and unconditional release of all hostages and ensures humanitarian access.

Myanmar Surpasses Afghanistan As World's Leading Opium Source In 2023: UN Report

- Myanmar has emerged as the world's largest source of opium in 2023, surpassing Afghanistan, according to a new report by the United Nations. This shift is attributed to a third consecutive year of expanding cultivation fueled by Myanmar's civil war and a significant decline in opium cultivation in Afghanistan.
- The shift resulted in a substantial increase in earnings for Myanmar farmers, with opium poppy farming yielding about 75% higher profits. The average price of opium poppies has risen to approximately \$355 per kilogram. The cultivation area has expanded by 18% year-on-year, reaching 47,000 hectares, marking the highest potential yield since 2001.

COP28 Concludes With Historic Agreement On Fossil Fuels

The 28th Conference of Parties (COP28) to the United

Nations Framework
Convention on
Climate Change
concluded with a
groundbreaking
decision — the

marking a historic step towards addressing the climate crisis.

• For the first time, participating parties agreed to confront the issue of fossil fuels, recognizing the imperative for a "fair and equitable" transition away from them. Developing nations emphasized the



absence of concrete financial commitments for their transition away from fossil fuels, raising questions about the global commitment to climate action.

However, Several developing countries, including Bolivia, Cuba, China, and members of the "G-77 and China" group, expressed dissatisfaction with the final text on fossil fuels. They argued that it undermined principles of equity and climate justice.

COP28 concludes: Highlights from the largest global climate summit

- The two-week-long COP28 in Dubai, United Arab Emirates (UAE), concluded on December 13 with member nations engaging in extended talks on the final text. In the closing plenary, COP28 President Jaber highlighted the summit's Sultan Al achievements, emphasizing a robust action plan aimed at limiting global warming to the targeted 1.5 degrees Celsius over pre-industrial times set in the 2015 Paris deal.
- The most significant achievement of COP28 is the historic agreement to begin reducing global consumption of fossil fuels. Unlike previous COP texts that focused on coal, COP28 marked the first time a global commitment was made to transition away from oil and gas, fundamental components of the global economy for decades. The Global Stocktake (GST) text outlines a just, orderly, and equitable transition, aiming for net-zero emissions by 2050.

UK Government Considers Social Media Limits For Under-16s

The UK government, led by Prime Minister Rishi Sunak, is

contemplating additional measures to **protect** teenagers below the age of 16 from dangers, online despite the recent



implementation of the Online Safety Act.

- The Online Safety Act, a landmark legislation mandating social media platforms to shield minors from harmful content or face substantial fines, marked a significant step toward ensuring online safety for children.
- In the coming year, the government plans to initiate a consultation to investigate the risks faced by

children using social media. The emphasis, according to official statements, is on empowering parents to navigate their children's online **experiences** rather than imposing strict regulations.

China Launches Deepest Lab On Earth, More Than 2.000m Below Ground

China has achieved a significant milestone in the field

of physics with the operationalization of the world's deepest and largest underground laboratory.



According to

report, the physics laboratory, known as the Deep Underground and Ultra-low Radiation Background Facility for Frontier Physics Experiments (DURF), reaches an impressive depth of 2,400 meters.

Jointly built by Tsinghua University and Yalong River Hydropower Development Company, Ltd., the facility provides unique testing conditions that are not available to scientists elsewhere. One of the primary objectives of DURF is to contribute significantly to the global search for dark matter—a mysterious form of matter that seems to defy interaction with light or the electromagnetic field.

President Sisi Secures Third Term Amid Economic Challenges

- Egypt's President Abdel Fattah al-Sisi has clinched a third term, garnering 89.6% of the vote in the nation's latest election, held from December 10-12. Despite economic hardships and regional tensions, Sisi's victory was anticipated, given the limited opposition.
- Egypt faces a severe economic crisis marked by a 36.4% annual inflation rate, impacting household budgets. Even before the crisis, about two-thirds of the population lived on or below the poverty line. The victory comes amid heightened regional tensions stemming from the Israel-Hamas war in neighboring Gaza, adding to the challenges faced by Sisi's administration.



JN.1 Variant Of COVID-19 Virus, All You Need To Know About It

- The World Health Organization (WHO) issued a warning on Sunday, December 17, expressing concerns over the evolving nature of the JN.1 COVID subvariant and the surge in respiratory diseases globally.
- The organization urged member states to prioritize sequence sharing and enhance surveillance efforts to better understand and combat the changing landscape of the virus
- JN.1 has distinct characteristics, spreading faster and demonstrating the ability to evade immunity. This alarming combination makes it capable of infecting individuals with prior COVID infections and those who have been vaccinated.
- In India, JN.1 was detected in Kerala on December 8, with a reported case in 79-year-old woman who experienced mild symptoms of Influenza like Illness (ILI). The country is urged to stay vigilant and implement necessary measures to contain the variant's spread.

Donald Trump Declared Ineligible To Run For President In Colorado By State's Supreme Court

• In a landmark decision, the Colorado Supreme Court,

Donald Trump ineligible for the presidency under the U.S. Constitution's insurrection clause.

- battle, as Trump's attorneys vowed to appeal the disqualification immediately to the U.S. Supreme Court, which holds the final authority on constitutional matters. The legal challenge revolves around whether the frontrunner for the GOP nomination can remain in the race.
- The court ruled that Trump is disqualified from holding the presidency under Section 3 of the 14th Amendment, which bars individuals who engaged in insurrection or rebellion against the Constitution from holding office. This decision stems from Trump's

alleged role in inciting the January 6, 2021, attack on the Capitol.

India Tops Global Remittance Charts With \$125 Billion In 2023: World Bank Report

- The World Bank's latest report reveals India's leading position in global remittances, reaching \$125 billion in 2023. Apart from India, the top five remittance recipient countries include Mexico (USD 67 billion), China (USD 50 billion), the Philippines (USD 40 billion), and Egypt (USD 24 billion).
- While remittances to low- and middle-income countries grew by 3.8%, challenges include declines in the Middle East and North Africa. The report sheds light on the sustained growth in remittance flows to low- and middle-income countries (LMICs) in 2023, albeit at a slower pace compared to previous years.

Argentina Rejects BRICS Membership Under President Javier Milei

Argentine President Javier Milei has officially

declined the invitation to join the BRICS (Brazil, Russia, India, China, South Africa) grouping of



major emerging economies.

- The rejection was conveyed through letters sent to BRICS leaders, solidifying Argentina's decision to abstain from the bloc. President Milei's rejection was grounded in the assertion that Argentina's membership was "not considered appropriate at this time."
- The letters emphasized a departure from the foreign policy approach of the previous administration, indicating a comprehensive review of decisions made earlier. The president highlighted that his geopolitical alignment prioritizes ties with the United States and Israel, eschewing alliances with communist nations.



India Bolsters Naval Strength With \$5 Billion Aircraft Carrier To Counter China

• India is set to reinforce its naval capabilities with the

addition of a \$5 billion aircraft carrier, signaling its strategic response to China's expanding naval influence in the Indian Ocean region.



- The Defense Acquisition Council is expected to greenlight the acquisition of a second indigenous aircraft carrier, costing nearly 400 billion rupees (\$4.8 billion).
- The new aircraft carrier is designed to accommodate a fleet of at least **28 fighter jets** and helicopters, with a displacement of 45,000 tons. Notably, the carrier will be equipped with French Rafale jets, showcasing India's commitment to advanced military technology.

Three Anti-Submarine Warfare Ships For Indian Navy Launched At Cochin Shipyard

- On 30th November 2023, the Cochin Shipyard marked a significant milestone with the simultaneous launch of the first three ships in a series of eight Anti-Submarine Warfare (ASW) shallow water crafts commissioned by the Indian Navy.
- The vessels, names INS Mahe, INS Malva and INS
 - Mangrol, were unveiled in a ceremony attended by distinguished naval officials and their spouses.



- Each Mahe class vessel measures 78 meters in length, 11.36 meters in width, with a draught of 2.7 meters. They have a displacement of 896 tonnes and can achieve speeds of up to 25 knots (approximately 45 km/h).
- With an endurance of **1,800 nautical miles**, these vessels are specifically designed to accommodate indigenously-developed sonars for underwater surveillance. The crew composition includes **57 personnel**, including seven naval officers.

India Navy Appointed First Woman Commanding Officer In Naval Ship

• In a groundbreaking move aligning with the

philosophy of 'all roles-all ranks,' the Indian Navy has achieved a historic milestone by appointing its first woman



commanding officer for a naval ship.

- Admiral Kumar proudly announced that the overall strength of women in the Navy, referred to as **Agniveers**, has surpassed the **1,000 mark**.
- This achievement underscores the Navy's commitment to an 'all roles, all ranks' approach, showcasing the diverse deployment of women across various responsibilities within the organization.

GRSE Delivers India's Largest Survey Vessel To Navy

• The Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers (GRSE) Ltd delivered the largest-ever survey vessel built in the country, INS Sandhayak, to the Indian Navy. The 110-



meter-long vessel is the first in a series of four survey ships being constructed by GRSE for the navy, marking a crucial milestone in the indigenous shipbuilding industry.

- The Sandhayak-class vessels boast comprehensive capabilities, making them invaluable assets to the Indian Navy. These survey ships can conduct full-scale coastal and deep-water hydrographic surveys, providing crucial data for port and harbor approaches, navigation channels, and routes.
- In addition to their primary survey functions, these vessels exhibit multi-role capabilities. Each ship can carry a helicopter, participate in low-intensity combat scenarios, and function as hospital ships.

Vice Admiral Dinesh Tripathi To Become India's New Vice Chief Of Navy Staff



- In a significant development within the Indian Navy, a major reshuffle is set to take place at the top echelons of the force, with Vice Admiral Dinesh Tripathi slated to assume the position of Vice Chief of Naval Staff on January 4.
- This transition marks a crucial moment for the Navy, as Vice Admiral Tripathi steps into a role responsibility for overseeing the modernization efforts of the force. Notably, the Indian Navy is set to acquire MQ-9B Predator drones and Rafale fighter jets, underscoring the strategic importance of the position.
- Vice Admiral Tripathi's appointment comes as Vice Admiral SJ Singh, the outgoing Vice Chief of Naval Staff, moves to take command of the Western Navy headquartered in Mumbai. This shift follows Vice Admiral Singh's tenure of around 9 months in the vice Chief's office, bringing a fresh perspective to the Western Naval Command.

Indian Navy Conducts Bi-Annual 'Prasthan' Exercise Off Mumbai Coast

- The Indian Navy, in collaboration with various defense, state, and civil agencies, recently concluded a comprehensive two-phased exercise named 'Prasthan' in the Offshore Development Area off the Mumbai coast.
- This exercise, conducted every six months, is pivotal in validating and refining measures and procedures aimed at addressing various contingencies that may arise in oil production platforms.
- The first phase of the exercise focused on simulating security emergencies, including potential terrorist attacks and bomb threats involving Improvised Explosive Devices (IEDs).
- The second phase of the exercise focused on responding to contingencies such as **fires on the oil platform** and assisting a disabled vessel in the offshore development area.

India, Vietnam Armies Start 11-Day Hanoi Exercise

• The Indian and Vietnamese Armies have initiated an 11-day military exercise in Vietnam, commencing on December 11. This collaborative endeavor, named "VINBAX-23," reflects the deepening strategic partnership between the two nations and is a response

- to shared concerns over China's assertive actions in the South China Sea.
- The joint military exercise is part of an expanding strategic engagement between India and Vietnam, emphasizing their commitment to counterbalance China's increasing aggression in the South China Sea. This collaboration aims to foster a collaborative partnership and enhance interoperability between the Indian and Vietnamese forces.
- The military exercise, VINBAX-23, spans from **December 11 to 21** and is hosted in **Hanoi**. The Indian contingent consists of **45 personnel**, including 39 from the Bengal Engineer Group's engineer regiment and six from the Army Medical Corps. Correspondingly, Vietnam has deployed 45 personnel for the drill.

India Successfully Flight Tests Indigenous High-Speed Flying-Wing UAV The Defence Ministry announced on Friday that the

 The Defence Ministry announced on Friday that the DRDO conducted a successful flight trial of the autonomous flying wing technology

demonstrator (an indigenous high-speed flying-wing Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV) in Karnataka's Chitradurga.



- With this achievement, India joins an elite club of countries that have mastered the controls for flying wing technology, showcasing a remarkable advancement in the nation's technological readiness levels.
- The UAV, designed and developed by DRDO's Aeronautical Development Establishment, marks a significant step leap in India's aerospace capabilities. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh commended the DRDO, armed forces and the industry for the successful flight trial, emphasizing the strengthening of the armed forces through the indigenous development of critical technologies.

Indian Army Organizes Table-Top Exercise To Empower ASEAN Women Officers

• In a significant step towards **fostering gender inclusivity** and strengthening the capabilities of women military personnel in peacekeeping operations,

IAF Successfully Testfires 'SAMAR' Air Defense Missile System In Andhra Pradesh



- It boasts twin 50-kW electric motors, a marine-grade LFP battery, and 6-kW solar power, propelling it to a top speed of 12 knots (23 kmph). The vessel's capabilities include a range of seven hours on a single charge, making it a formidable addition to eco-friendly maritime transportation.

The chairperson of the Commission enjoys the status of a Minister of State, Government of India.

BCCI Decides To Retire MS Dhoni's Iconic No.7 Jersey



- With an estimated 90,000 to 150,000 individuals HIV-positive in 1988, they proposed the idea to Dr. Johnathan Mann, Director of the AIDS Global Program, who approved it for December 1.

International Day For The Abolition Of Slavery 2023

- The International Day for the Abolition of Slavery is observed annually on December 2nd. This day serves as a poignant reminder of the enduring struggle against slavery and its modern forms.
- Assembly's adoption of the Convention for the Suppression of the Traffic in Persons and the Exploitation of the Prostitution of Others on December 2, 1949.

Armed Forces Flag Day 2023
