Gujarat Sets Guinness Record In Mass Surya Namaskar

• Gujarat, known for its rich cultural heritage and

commitment to health and wellness, achieved a remarkable feat on New Year's morning by making an indelible mark in the Guinness Book of World Records.



- The state hosted the largest simultaneous Surya Namaskar performance, involving over 4,000 participants from 108 locations across 51 categories.
- The chosen number of 108 holds special significance in Indian culture, and the venues for the mega event included the iconic **Modhera Sun Temple**. In Vedic culture, esteemed mathematicians regarded 108 as a symbol of complete existence, linking it to the Sun, Moon, and Earth.

ISRO Launches XPoSat: India's First X-Ray Polarimeter Satellite

• On January 1, ISRO successfully lifted off

the **XPoSat** (X-ray Polarimeter Satellite) along with 10 other satellites from the Sriharikota spaceport, using the reliable PSLV-C58 rocket.



- The primary objective of XPoSat is to investigate the polarization of intense X-ray sources in space. XPoSat is India's maiden X-Ray satellite designed for detecting X-rays emanating from exotic objects such as neutron stars and black holes.
- The PSLV-C58 Mission is pivotal in propelling the XPoSat Satellite into an eastward low inclination orbit. Following the injection of XPoSat, the PS4 stage will undergo two re-starts to reduce the orbit into a 350 km circular orbit.
- This adjustment aims to maintain the satellite in a 3axis stabilized mode, facilitating Orbital Platform (OP) experiments, according to ISRO.

Flipkart's Binny Bansal Launches Opp Door

- BinnyBansal, co-founder of **Flipkart**, has ventured into the e-commerce space once again with his latest startup, **OppDoor**. The startup aims to facilitate the global expansion of e-commerce firms by offering comprehensive end-to-end solutions.
- The timing of OppDoor's launch is noteworthy, aligning with the conclusion of the five-year non-compete clause that accompanied the sale of Flipkart to Walmart. This clause restricted BinnyBansal from participating in e-commerce ventures until 2023, and now, OppDoor emerges as the result of this awaited freedom.

Rajasthan Seeks Integration Of Chiranjeevi Scheme With Ayushman Bharat

 The newly elected BJP government in Rajasthan is making strides to merge its state health insurance scheme, Chiranjeevi, with the central Ayushman

Bharat programme.

• This move, pending approval from the union health ministry, aims to create a unified initiative called the Ayushman



Bharat MukhyamantriChiranjeevi Health Insurance Scheme.

- Officials reveal that the integrated scheme will maintain Chiranjeevi's existing benefits, providing a substantial ₹25 lakh insurance cover applicable to both private and government hospitals.
- The Chiranjeevi scheme, initially introduced by former Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot of the Congress party, currently offers significantly higher coverage compared to Ayushman Bharat's ₹5 lakh.

PMModiInaugurates ₹1,156 Crore Projects In Lakshadweep

• In a significant development, Prime Minister

NarendraModi inaugurated projects worth ₹1,156 crore during his visit to the Lakshadweep islands. Among these projects is the Kochi-Lakshadweep Islands Submarine Optical Fibre



Cable, a ₹1,072-crore initiative providing 100 Gbps internet connectivity to the islands.



The undersea cable link, executed by Japanese firm NEC and laid by BSNL, promises 100 times faster internet for the residents of Lakshadweep. Covering 1,868 kilometers, it connects Kavaratti, Agatti, Amini, Kadmat, Chetlet, Kalpeni, Minicov, Androth, Bangaram, Kiltan, and Bitra. This initiative allows telecom companies to offer 4G, 5G, and high-speed broadband for the first time in the archipelago.

Reliance Industries Achieves India's First ISCC-**Plus Certification**

- Reliance Industries Limited (RIL) achieved a significant milestone by becoming the first in India to produce ISCC-Plus certified chemically recycled polymers. The ISCC-Plus certification applies to RIL's Jamnagar refinery, situated in the state of Gujarat.
- On December 29, RIL proudly declared that it had successfully shipped its inaugural batch of ISCC-Plus polymers, certified circular named CircuRepol (polypropylene) and CircuRelene (polyethylene), to an undisclosed client.
- Companies obtaining ISCC Plus certification commit to ensuring that the sustainability of their raw materials can be transparently traced from the field to the store.

ISRO's Satellite Set For Launch AboardSpaceX's Falcon 9 Rocket

NewSpace India Ltd (NSIL), the commercial arm of the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO), has

announced its collaboration with **SpaceX**, the to launch communication satellite GSAT-20.



This marks India's partnership

with SpaceX, reflecting a significant stride in space exploration and satellite deployment.

- GSAT-20, now renamed **GSAT-N2**, is a **high** throughput Ka-band satellite designed to meet the growing broadband communication needs of India.
- With a weight of 4,700 kg, GSAT-20 offers a substantial HTS capacity of nearly 48 Gbps, specifically address the tailored service

requirements of remote and unconnected regions in the country.

Adidas To Set Up Its First Asia GCC Outside China In Tamil Nadu

- Adidas, the renowned athletic footwear and apparel giant, is making strategic moves to enhance its global operations by establishing its first and only Global Capacity Centre (GCC) in Asia outside of China.
- This significant development underscores the growing trend of multinational corporations choosing India as a prime destination for setting up their GCCs, capitalizing on the country's abundant software skills.
- German corporation, The headquartered Herzogenaurach, Bavaria, is set to establish its Global Business Services (GBS) hub in Chennai. This move signifies a pivotal step for Adidas, as the Chennai facility becomes the first GCC outside of China in Asia. The choice of Chennai as the location for this hub reflects the city's rising prominence in the global corporate landscape.

Ayodhya Airport Renamed As 'Maharishi Valmiki **International Airport'**; Gains International Status

The Union Cabinet recently gave its approval to declare Ayodhya

Airport an international airport. The airport will be named "Maharishi Valmiki

International Airport,



Ayodhyadham," reflecting the historical and cultural significance of the region.

- According to the government's press release, elevating Ayodhya Airport to international status is crucial for realizing the city's economic potential. Furthermore, it acknowledges Ayodhya's significance as a global pilgrimage site, with the international status expected to attract foreign pilgrims and tourists.
- The airport's development will occur in phases. In its initial phase, the airport will have the capacity to handle 10 lakh (1 million) passengers annually. After the second phase of development, Maharishi Valmiki International Airport is expected to cater to a staggering 60 lakh (6 million) commuters annually.

Chennai Tops As Best City For Indian Women





- **Tamil Nadu** cities topped both categories that the study covered 49 cities in the million-plus population category and 64 cities in the less than a million-population category.

ONGC Begins First Oil Production In Krishna-Godavari Deep-Water Block

Oil and Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC), one of India's leading energy exploration and production

companies, achieved a significant milestone on January 7 by commencing the first oil production from the deep-water KG-DWN 98/2 Block.



- Located in the Krishna Godavari (KG) basin off the Bay of Bengal on the **Kakinada coast**, this development marks a crucial step forward in India's energy landscape.
- The anticipated peak production from the 98/2 field is remarkable, with expectations set at around 45,000 barrels of oil per day and over 10 Million Metric Standard Cubic Metres per Day (MMSCMD) of gas.
- As the project advances, ONGC is actively working towards the final phase of the 98/2 block, with efforts underway to commence the production of the remaining oil and natural gas by mid-2024.

Fresh Oil Discovery In Krishna-Godavari Basin By ONGC


Gujarat, Kerala, Karnataka Lead InStartup Ecosystem Development: DPIIT

- Only those with a minimum qualification of graduation are eligible to teach. Coaching centres are prohibited from making false claims about ranks or marks to entice students. Students below 16 years old cannot be enrolled, and admission is allowed only for post-secondary school examinations.
- These guidelines come in response to growing concerns about student welfare, unregulated growth of private coaching, and rising cases of student suicides and other incidents linked to coaching centres.

Ram Mandir PranPratishtha: World's Largest Lock, 1265 Kg Laddoo Prasad Arrive In Ayodhya

• As the Ram Mandir in Ayodhya gears up for its PranPratishtha (consecration) ceremony, it has

- received two unique offerings: the world's largest lock, weighing 400 kg, and a colossal 1,265 kg laddoo Prasad.
- Crafted by **SatyaPrakash Sharma**, a 65-year-old locksmith from Aligarh, the lock is a remarkable piece of artistry. Measuring ten feet in length and four and a half feet in width, the lock was made over six months.
- Nagabhushanam Reddy, owner of Sri Ram Catering Services in Hyderabad, prepared the massive laddoo Prasad. Reddy, inspired by his faith, had pledged to prepare 1 kg of laddoo for each day of his life as a mark of devotion.
- The preparation of this gigantic laddoo involved 25 men working tirelessly for three days. The laddoo was transported to Ayodhya in a refrigerated glass box, ensuring its preservation for up to a month.

RamMandir Inauguration, The Significance Of The 84-Second 'MoolMuhurat'

- The Ram Mandir in Ayodhya, a significant and much-anticipated development in India's cultural and religious landscape, is set for inauguration.
- A focal point of this grand event is the **84-second** '**MoolMuhurat**', an auspicious moment during which the idol of Ram Lalla will be consecrated.
- This 84-second period is part of the larger 'AbhijitMuhurat', a 48-minute window considered extremely sacred in Hindu astrology. The 'AbhijitMuhurat' on the day of the inauguration begins at 12:16 PM and ends at 12:59 PM.
- The 'MoolMuhurat' is seen as a moment of profound spiritual and cultural importance in India. The choice of this specific time is believed to bring blessings and positivity, not just to the temple but to the entire nation.

Sony Terminates \$10 Billion Merger Deal With Zee Entertainment

- On January 22, Sony issued a notice terminating the merger agreement with Zee Entertainment Enterprises Ltd and Culver Max Entertainment Private Limited, formerly known as Sony Pictures Networks India Pvt Ltd. The \$10-billion deal, signed on December 22, 2021, faced challenges in meeting closing conditions within the specified timeframe.
- The definitive agreements outlined a provision that mandated discussions for extending the merger's end date if it did not close within 24 months after the signature date. However, as closing conditions were





not met by the specified end date, termination of the agreement became an option.



the first significant cyclone impact on the island nation in the ongoing 2023cyclone 2024

ICC Rule Changes In Cricket: Stumping Replays Limited; Concussion Substitute And BCCI's Decision

- In a significant alteration to cricket playing conditions, the International Cricket Council (ICC) has restricted the Decision Review System (DRS) for stumping incidents.
- Effective from December 12, 2023, teams can now only challenge caught-behind decisions with a separate DRS option, preventing misuse observed in the 2020 series against India.
- The amended rule mandates umpires to rely solely on side-on camera images for stumping reviews, eliminating the examination of potential snicks. This ensures a focused review for stumped incidents without allowing teams a free review for other modes of dismissal.

Ministry Of Youth Affairs & Sports Announced The National Sports Awards 2023

- The Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports announced the National Sports Awards 2023, honouring individuals and institutions that have excelled in their respective fields.

- Australia's skipper, Pat Cummins, capped off a stellar year with the ICC Men's Player of the Month award for December. Cummins played a pivotal role in Australia's Test series triumph against Pakistan, displaying exceptional leadership and bowling prowess.
- India's Deepti Sharma made history by winning her maiden ICC Women's Player of the Month award for December. Sharma's exceptional performances across all three formats, especially against England and Australia, earned her this well-deserved recognition.

Praggnanandhaa Surpasses Viswanathan AnandTo Become India's No.1 Chess Player

- Rameshbabu Praggnanandhaa, an 18-year-old chess prodigy from Chennai, achieved a historic milestone in his career by defeating World Champion Ding Liren from China.
- The win against Ding Liren not only marked a personal victory for Praggnanandhaa but also led him to surpass the legendary **ViswanathanAnand** as the top-rated Indian player.
- With a FIDE live rating of 2748.3, Praggnanandhaa marginally edged past Anand's rating of 2748. This achievement places Praggnanandhaa as the second Indian, following Anand, to defeat a reigning world champion in classical chess. He had previously defeated Ding Liren at the Tata Steel tournament in 2023 as well.

Rohit Sharma Tops List Of Batters With Most Hundreds In T20

- Indian cricket team captain **Rohit Sharma** has created history by becoming the first batsman to score five centuries in T20 Internationals (T20Is). This milestone was achieved during the third T20I match against Afghanistan in Bengaluru on January 17, 2024.
- Rohit Sharma scored an unbeaten 121 runs off 69 balls, which included 11 fours and eight sixes, showcasing his exceptional batting skills.
- The partnership between Rohit and Rinku Singh was crucial, amounting to 190 runs for the fifth wicket, setting a record for the highest T20I partnership for India.

SueRedfern: ICC's First Female Neutral Umpire In Bilateral Series

- In a groundbreaking development for women's cricket, **Sue Redfern** from **England** is set to become the **first ICC-appointed female neutral umpire** to officiate in a bilateral series.
- Redfern's appointment is a result of the International Cricket Council's (ICC) decision to have one neutral umpire for all ICC Women's Championship series and T20I matches associated with them.
- This move is aimed at ensuring a degree of neutrality in match officiating while also contributing to the long-term development of female umpires in the sport. Seven female neutral umpires, including Sue Redfern, will officiate across ICC Women's Championship series.

Tata Group Secures IPL Title Sponsorship For Next 5 Years

- Tata Sons Private Limited has successfully utilized its Right to Match card, retaining the prestigious title sponsorship of the Indian Premier League (IPL) for the upcoming five seasons, spanning 2024 to 2028.
- This development follows the Board of Control for Cricket in India's (BCCI) release of an Invitation to Tender (ITT) for Title Sponsor Rights in late December 2023.
- In 2022, **Tata Group** had initially replaced Chinese mobile manufacturer Vivo as the IPL title sponsor for the 2022 and 2023 seasons, contributing INR 365 crore per season. With their current decision to retain the title sponsorship, the group is poised for an extended and prominent association with the world's most lucrative cricket league.



ICC Awards 2023: Rohit Sharma Named Captain Of ICC ODI Team Of The Year

- The International Cricket Council (ICC) announced five ICC Teams of the Year across formats for men and women as part of the ICC Awards 2023. Six Indians were featured in the ICC Men's ODI team of the year with Rohit Sharma named as the captain of the 11-member team.
- The announcement of the five teams the ICC Men's and Women's T20I Teams of the Year, the ICC Men's and Women's ODI Teams of the Year and the ICC Men's Test Team of the Year were made in a staggered manner over Monday and Tuesday and feature players from 11 teams selected based on international performances through the calendar year.

ICC Awards 2023

- The ICC Awards 2023, organized by the International Cricket Council, represents the pinnacle of recognition for international cricket players.
- Bas de Leede was named as the ICC Men's Associate Cricketer of the Year 2023 for his remarkable all-round run in the year. He was the standout player for the Netherlands at the ICC Men's Cricket World Cup 2023 Qualifier and the World Cup in India.
- Queentor Abel made Kenya proud by winning the ICC Women's Associate Cricketer of the Year for 2023. She picked 30 T20I wickets at an unreal average of 7.36, and scored 476 T20I runs at 34.

Rohan Bopanna: A New Milestone At 43 As The Oldest World No. 1 In Men's Doubles

- Indian tennis star RohanBopanna has etched his name in the history books by becoming the oldest player to claim the No. 1 spot in the men's doubles rankings at the age of 43.
- This remarkable achievement was secured following his quarter-final victory at the 2024 Australian Open, alongside Australia's Matthew Ebden.
- Bopanna's accomplishment surpasses the previous record held by American tennis player Mike Bryan, who was 41 years and 76 days old when he was ranked World No. 1 in men's doubles in 2019.

Netherlands Won FIH Hockey5s Women's World Cup

- **India** finished as runner-up at the inaugural edition of the FIH Hockey 5s Women's World Cup after a 7-2 loss to the **Netherlands** in the final in Muscat.
- India tried to make a comeback and scored twice
 JyotiChhatri (20th minute) and



RutajaDadasoPisal (23rd minute) – but could not catch the Dutch team which added one more goal courtesy of Kalse before the full-time hooter.

Australian Open 2024 Winners: Sinner, SabalenkaAndBopanna Shine

- Jannik Sinner secured his first Grand Slam in men's singles, while ArynaSabalenka claimed her second in women's singles. RohanBopanna, at 43, became the oldest man to win men's doubles. Hsieh Su-Wei and Elise Mertens won women's doubles, and Hsieh, with Jan Zielinski, clinched mixed doubles.
- Jannik Sinner (Italy) claimed his maiden Grand Slam title, defeating Daniil Medvedev in a thrilling five-set Australian Open final in Melbourne. He became the 27th different men's singles winner in Melbourne since the Open era began in 1969 and the first Italian to achieve this feat.
- At 22 years and 165 days, Sinner is the youngest Australian Open champion since Novak Djokovic in 2008. Novak Djokovic holds the Open era record for most Australian Open titles (10), followed by Roger Federer (6) and Andre Agassi (4).




ideas of Swami Vivekananda, aiming to foster national development.
